Minutes of APC Meeting - Area D

October 8, 2014 starting 7:00pm - Estuary Centre

Agenda: Development Permit Application 23-D-DP (Money/MacAlpine)

Members Attending: Robert Stitt (chair and secretary), Peter Holmes, Kerrie Talbot and Calvin Slade.

Applicants Attending: Jim Money and Doug MacAlpine

<u>Purpose of DPA</u>: - To obtain a Development Permit in order to allow the construction of two buildings on Pier 67, a workshop and a restroom building. The subject property is within the Marine DPA in Electoral Area D.

Meeting called to order at 7:00pm.

- Jim Money and Doug MacAlpine provided background on the application. Key points:
 - o The restroom is already built. It will serve pedestrian and live-aboard traffic and be connected to and be a collection point for the pending sewer hook-ups. It was clad in vinyl siding to save weight on its small float area.
 - Purpose of workshop is the fabrication of upholstery by an existing business. The floating workshop will be owned by the business owners who live in a nearby float home and wish to bring their business closer to the bay and their home. The building will move with the owners should they decide to relocate.
- Issues discussed by APC:
 - What will the workshop be used for?: Assurances that all activities will be of a lowimpact kind with no motor repairs or other activities that could contaminate the marine environment.
 - What will be the external appearance?: Owners intend to finish the exterior to reflect the character of the village, with natural materials and an 'artistic' approach favoured by APC members.
 - o What is the impact on parking and pedestrian traffic? The marina owners have assigned two parking spaces within the marina property for the business there is also an unloading area within the marina. Pedestrian traffic is not expected to be significant as this will be a workshop rather than a retail destination.
 - The committee noted that the shading of the estuarine environment would be addressed by CEEMC and so did not discuss.

Moved by Peter Holmes, seconded by Kerrie Talbot, that:

- the APC supports the application as proposed with the understanding that:
 - o the workshop is used for low-impact purposes as described by the applicants
 - o the exterior is finished in natural materials that reflect the character of the bay.

Vote: All in favour.
