Re: The Hub, Area E (Cowichan Station / Glenora)

- Proposal for a multipurpose facility @ the old Cowichan Station Elementary School location, meant to be the The Hub of the community. Priority: youth programs, café, green building, community garden, gym and theatre etc. It's called The Hub because its goal is to reduce the amount of travel that people of the community have to make for services, and thereby reducing their carbon footprint.
- 2. District D and E are neighbours, so it would benefit both communities to have mutual communication and connections.
- 3. Motion (by Kerrie): in favour of supporting The Hub; to connect our communities with off road walking trails. Motion seconded by Val. All in favour.

New Business

- 1. The Tug in front of the Maritime Museum needs to be moved and it has been offered to Parks. Maritime Center will front the costs to move & install. Do we want it for a climbing structure? Or as an historical artifact acknowledging Cowichan Bay's logging history (installed near old booming grounds)? Questions to investigate: How do they want it maintained? Will the Museum help Parks to maintain it? How much is it to maintain? Will it go by the boat launch? Or booming grounds?
- 2. Coverdale Watson: survey of community needs to be done to help influence the design of the court. Steve to make brochure before Townhall meeting to a) ask for community feedback b) invite the local area to the townhall

3. Waterline Vandalism: water was spewing in Coverdale Watson park. Lori and Kerrie to find out the contact person on these occasions.
