The Cowichan Valley Regional Hospital District (CVRHD) provides capital funding to Island Health for the following facilities:

- · Cowichan District Hospital
- · Cairnsmore Place
- · Ladysmith Community Health
- \cdot Chemainus Health Care Centre

Capital funding is cost-shared, with the province funding 60% and the CVRHD funding 40%.

Since 2010, the CVRHD has been putting funds aside to raise the Regional Hospital District's 40% share of the new Cowichan District Hospital.

Construction began in 2022 and it is anticipated that the hospital will be ready to welcome the first patients into the new facility in late 2027.
