

#### The Board approved:

#### Vancouver Island University Agriculture Development Program Update

Releasing the funds for the \$10,000 2024 contribution to the Vancouver Island University Agriculture Program Development Project, based upon completion of the terms and conditions of the Contribution Agreement. The funding is allocated by the Economic Development Cowichan Division in each of the 2024 and 2025 budget years with the intent of supporting the staffing required to coordinate the activities involved in developing and offering professional development and training programs for the agriculture and food-related sectors of the Cowichan region.

#### Mesachie Lake Hall Post Office Lease Agreement 2025-2030

The CVRD will enter into a lease agreement with Heather Campbell, for the Mesachie Lake Hall Post Office, 9315 South Shore Rd., Mesachie Lake, BC, commencing immediately from the previous tenant, in the sum of \$177.26 per month, plus applicable taxes until May 31, 2025, thereafter the remaining financial terms as outlined in the agreement.

#### Public Feedback on the 2025 Budget

For the 2025 budget, a change was made to the format of public consultation. The new format included an online video presentation outlining the 2025 budget, as well as four open houses held throughout the Cowichan Valley Regional District (CVRD). The video presentation was developed to outline basic budget information, including specific impacts on all areas within the CVRD. It was recorded and linked to the CVRD website and social media pages. Details about the open houses were included on the CVRD Events Calendar and advertised on the CVRD website and social media platforms.

#### The following is being recommended by the EASC to the Board

#### **British Columbia Water Meter Pilot Project Application**

CVRD Utilities Division proposes that an application be submitted to the British Columbia Water Meter Pilot Project for funding to implement Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) in the three remaining unmetered water systems.

#### Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw - 2025 Engagement Plan

CVRD Community Planning Division recommends that the Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw Project Charter (January 2025), be endorsed.

#### The following is being recommended by the COTW to the Board

#### Request for Additional Funding from Island Corridor Foundation (ICF)

That \$30,000 be provided to the Island Corridor Foundation from the Strategic Investment Fund within Function 100 - General Government for their participation in the shared visioning project; and that staff be directed to write a letter to the Ministry of Transportation and Transit requesting that the Province provide ongoing funding to support the Island Corridor Foundation in continuation of their proposed work.


The CVRD is conducting a 2025 Community Satisfaction Survey!


Each year, the Leader in Sustainability Award is granted to organizations that display an exceptional commitment to environmental stewardship through the responsible management of end-of-life batteries. Through our partnership with the Recycle Your Batteries Canada battery and recycling program, we were able to divert 10, 224 batteries from the landfill.

"We hope to see more materials come under ERP in the future."

Free battery recycling is available at all three of the CVRD's Recycling Depots: Bings Creek, Peerless Road and Meade Creek. All 3 depots recycle household batteries (all disposable, rechargeable, and cell phone batteries accepted) and vehicle batteries (car and truck batteries; all sizes and types of lead-acid units accepted). # Modernized curbside collection is coming to residents of Duncan, North Cowichan and CVRD

In preparation for automated curbside collection and the collection of additional waste categories in some areas, residents are encouraged to check which jurisdiction provides their service.

A modernized solid waste curbside collection service is coming to residents living in the City of Duncan, the Municipality of North Cowichan, and Cowichan Valley's Electoral Areas (CVRD) this spring and summer. In preparation for automated curbside collection and the collection of additional waste categories in some areas,

residents are encouraged to check which jurisdiction provides their service.

The use of automated curbside collection trucks and collection carts help to reduce repetitive injuries to curbside collection workers and protect them during weather events such as heat waves.

#### **LATEST NEWS**

Residents will also benefit from being able to dispose of larger volumes of material and include yard waste along with food waste in the organics cart.

To facilitate the modernization of curbside collection services, residents that currently have service from Duncan, North Cowichan, or the CVRD will be getting new collection carts that will be compatible with the automated trucks.

The new carts will be delivered to residents this spring, along with detailed information to help residents adjust to the changes and support successful curbside collection in all areas.
