




## Koksilah Watershed Highlight - Every Drop Counts!

## **Did You Know?**



Did you know that the Koksilah River, located south of Duncan is currently experiencing extremely low flows? Many of the large farms are co-operating to alternate water use. All water users in the watershed are being asked to do their part and reduce household water use by 50%.

The Koksilah is especially vulnerable to drought because there is no natural or human made reservoir to help control water flows throughout the year. Excess rainfall from winter months is unable to be stored and used to maintain flows during the drought season. The river is also home to many species of fish who, like us, are stressed by the heat. Please be mindful when spending time near the river and do not catch or trap the young salmon.



# First Artificial Intelligence upskilling program for small businesses on Vancouver Island

Economic Development Cowichan and Community Futures Central Island (CFCI) are bringing the first regionally focused Artificial Intelligence (AI) training program to Vancouver Island, designed specifically for small businesses, nonprofits, and solopreneurs.

The program, titled AI Upskilling Central Island for Small Business: Work Smarter, Not Harder with AI, offers practical, hands-on learning to help participants harness Artificial Intelligence to save time, streamline operations, and boost productivity. With support from the Province of British Columbia, the program combines expert-led workshops, one-on-one support, and a collaborative learning community. "We are proud to lead the way in supporting Cowichan businesses that want to leverage AI in practical ways to improve operations," said Barry O'Riordan, Manager of Economic Development Cowichan. "Sign up soon, as space is limited."

Over three months, participants will attend three interactive workshops and access ongoing support including four AI office hours with industry experts, access to the local AI community of practice, and tools, templates, and practical resources to put ideas into action. By the end of the program, participants will have the skills and strategies to confidently integrate AI into their business.

This program is ideal for business owners and nonprofit leaders across the Regional District of Nanaimo and the Cowichan Valley Regional District, including rural communities and the municipalities of Duncan, Lake Cowichan, Ladysmith, and North Cowichan. It is designed for leaders facing staffing shortages, burnout, operational inefficiencies, or pressures to modernize.

Valued at \$2,999, the program is offered at a deeply discounted rate. The first 10 seats are offered at \$199; the next 5 at \$249; and the final 5 seats at \$299. Complete all three workshops and receive a \$100 credit toward future Advanced AI sessions launching in 2026.

# Statement from the Chair of the CVRD Board re: Cowichan Valley transit strike

"On behalf of the Cowichan Valley Regional District, I want to express our increasing concern with the ongoing community impact of the public transit strike.

Now the longest transit strike in British Columbia's history, our residents who rely on public transit have faced undue hardships over the last six months without access to this vital public service. This labour dispute between BC Transit's contractor – Transdev Canada – and their unionized employees is disproportionately impacting the most vulnerable people in our communities. This includes our youth, seniors, people with disabilities, and those who cannot afford a vehicle. For these most vulnerable groups, the inability to access transit has resulted in missed medical appointments, lost jobs, interrupted education, hitchhiking risks, and increased loneliness and isolation.

We've heard directly from residents and families across the region about the direct impacts on their lives and wellbeing. A family in Honeymoon Bay, one of our western most and isolated communities, wrote to us about the necessity for transit to ensure they and their seven children have access to essential healthcare services given their significant health issues.

A family in Shawnigan Lake told us about their challenges in accessing adult education and apprenticeship programs, jeopardizing their education as well as significantly increasing travel costs to Duncan and North Cowichan.
