

## New Regional Services Established

Following public approval via a regional referenda in the 2022 Local Government Elections, the CVRD Board of Directors adopted Bylaw No. 4438, establishing the Regional Recreation Funding Services.

The Regional Recreation Funding Services provide an equitable funding model for nine regionally significant recreation facilities, base on each jurisdiction's usage of the facilities. The new funding model is being phased in over a three year period.

## Cowichan Valley Regional Hospital District

The Cowichan Valley Regional Hospital District (CVRHD) provides capital funding to Island Health for the following facilities within its boundaries:

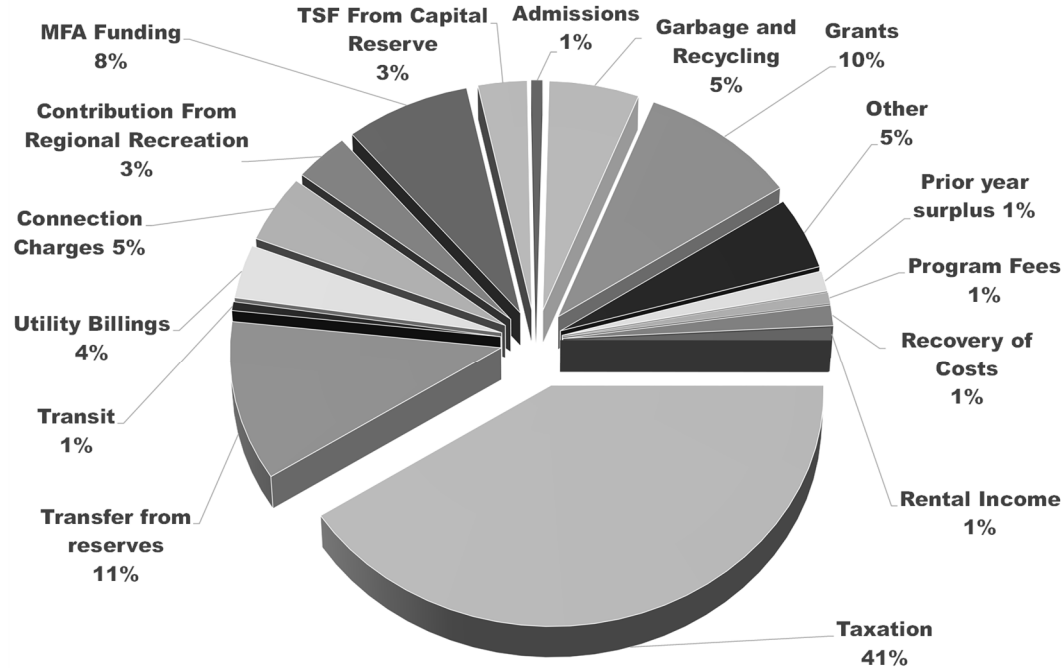
- Cowichan District Hospital
- Cairnsmore Place
- Ladysmith Community Health
- Chemainus Health Care Centre

Capital funding is cost-shared with the province on a 60/40 basis, with the CVRHDs portion being 40%.

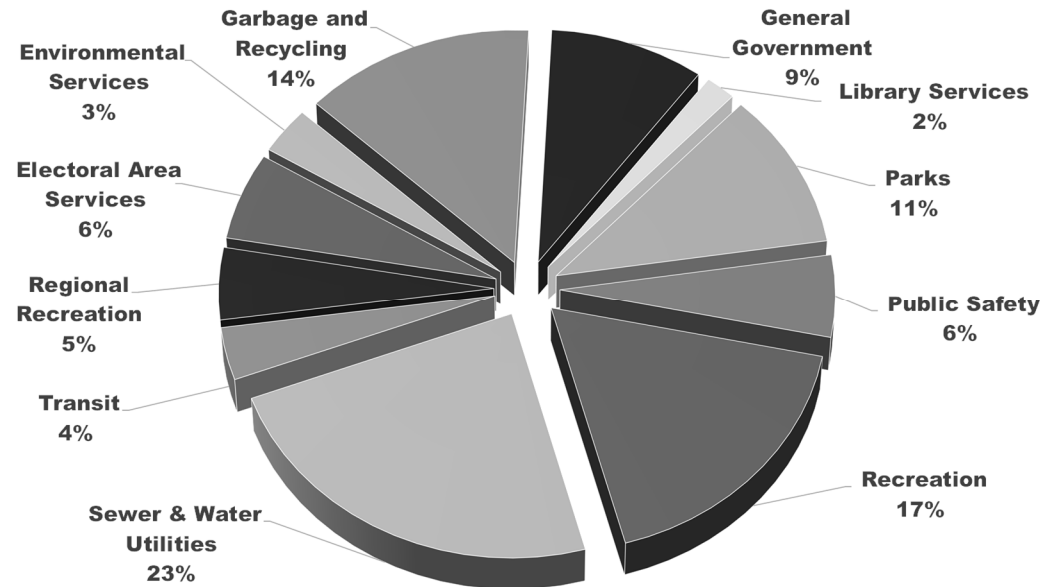
Starting in 2010, the CVRHD has been putting funds aside to raise the Regional Hospital District's 40% share of the new hospital.

Construction has begun in 2022 and it is anticipated that the hospital will be ready to welcome the first patients into the new facility in late 2028.

## Message from the Chair

The Cowichan Valley Regional District stretches from the Nanaimo Airport in the north to the Malahat in the south, and from the west coast of Vancouver Island to Valdes Island to the east. All of this is divided into 9 Electoral Areas and 4 Municipalities. Elected representatives from the 13 jurisdictions come together at the CVRD Board to work with CVRD staff to provide 178 local and regional services to the over 89,000 people in our region.

With a newly elected Board of Directors and new senior management staff joining the organization, we are well positioned to respond to the challenges facing our region, and continue to provide a high level of service to our residents. Although the COVID-19 pandemic is now behind us, we face a new series of financial challenges related to the increased costs of inflation, rising interest rates, and the continued housing crisis.

We have made every effort to reduce the increased financial burden to taxpayers in our 2023 budget. However, the cost associated with the new regional recreation funding model approved by referendum, as well as the rising costs of maintaining our current service levels, have resulted in a 11.49% average increase to taxation by the CVRD. This percentage increase is in line with the majority of regional districts across the province, who like us, find themselves challenged to meet current demands while striving to be fiscally conservative.

I want to assure you that our Board, will continue to advocate on behalf of all of the businesses and residents in the CVRD for support from our senior governments to ensure our region can maintain its high standards for quality of life, protection of the environment, and forward-thinking policies. ## Understanding Your Tax Notice

You have just received your 2023 property tax notice from the province. The Province collects taxes for schools, roads, policing, Regional District services and the Regional Hospital District. The CVRD receives a lump sum payment from the province in August of each year.

The following will explain each line on your property tax notice.

### Provincial Services

#### Provincial School Tax

The Province collects this tax for education and school facilities.

#### Provincial Rural Tax and Police Tax

The Provincial Government tax is for rural road maintenance provided by the Province and police protection services

### Local Services

#### F Cowichan Valley

This is your electoral area tax for services provided by the CVRD.

#### Cowichan Valley Hospital

The CVRHD provides capital funding for the hospital facilities in this region.

#### BC Assessment

BC Assessment Authority is a crown corporation that sets all property values in the province. Their costs are recovered by this tax.

#### Municipal Finance Authority

The Municipal Finance Authority coordinates financial borrowing for all local governments in the province.

#### Other Local Services

Persons who own property within the following specified areas will also be assessed these taxes:
