Harmonizing Electoral Area Official Community Plans

The CVRD is currently undertaking harmonization of its seven Electoral Area Official Community Plans (OCPs) and nine Zoning Bylaws to create one unified OCP and one Zoning Bylaw. This is part of ongoing efforts to harmonize and modernize the Regional District's numerous land use Planning policy and regulatory documents. There is as much as 30 years between the oldest and newest CVRD OCPs. Issues, regulations, and even terminology have changed considerably over this period.

In addition, the harmonization project will reduce the size of the exiting OCPs by about 50%, removing repetitive and sometimes conflicting objectives and policies that unnecessarily clutter and complicate the planning process. The outcome of this administrative exercise will be a single. stream-lined OCP document for all CVRD electoral areas with complementary local area plans for village areas focussing on the particular character of each area. The project also includes harmonizing the CVRD's nine zoning bylaws into a single integrated bylaw to complement and implement the policies contained with the harmonized OCP.

A steering committee, comprised of the Chairs from each Electoral Area Advisory Planning Commission, has been established to help work through the review process by providing oversight with respect to harmonized policies, land use designations, development permits, etc. it is anticipated that the first draft with be completed by spring 2019.

This work reflects the vision set out within the Cowichan 2050 project by improving the coordination and collaboration in land use planning within the region.
