Province restricts open burning across much of the Cowichan region

Duncan, BC – The Province of BC has restricted open burning for all high smoke sensitivity zones in the province, which includes the Cowichan Valley.

The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy, in collaboration with provincial public health partners, has issued open burning restrictions for all High Smoke Sensitivity Zones across the province until Wednesday April 15th, 2020. No new fires may be initiated and no additional material may be added to existing fires.

This provincial order overrides the Cowichan Valley Regional District Smoke Control Regulation Bylaw, which permits open burning between March 15 and April 15 when the venting index is 'good.'

"We appreciate the Province and health authorities for recognizing the importance of preventing air quality degradation and taken necessary action during this critical time," said Aaron Stone, Chair of the Cowichan Valley Regional District. "We expect all residents to comply with this direction, and will be resourcing enforcement action as required going forward."
