Community Heritage Register

At the time the local area plans were prepared, electoral area G contained no sites included on the Community Heritage Register.

Candidates

Heritage resources that may have significant heritage value and will be considered for inclusion in the CVRD Community Heritage Register (CHR) include but are not limited to the following:

1. *Saltair Community Centre*: In 2014, the CVRD purchased a five and half acre property and building formerly known as Mount Brenton Elementary. The school lands were incorporated into neighboring Centennial Park, significantly increasing the Park's green space. The former school building now operates as a community centre.

The first school, named South Oyster School, was built in 1885. In late 1949 a new school was built on the same site and renamed Mount Brenton Elementary School after the local mountain landmark.

2. *Saltair Station House*: To be defined.

Points of Interest

Sites of noteworthy local interest.

1. *Boulder Point*: Boulder Point beach at the end of South Oyster Road offers a lovely sandy beach at low tide, suitable for swimming, snorkeling and beach picnics. It is known for the large boulder left over from the glacier age.
2. *Diana, Princess of Wales Wilderness Park*: Diana, Princess of Wales Park has an easy walking trail that leads you through beautiful natural landscapes from Olsen Road to Rocky Beach Drive. The park was created through the gracious donation of 23.3 acres to the CVRD in 2001.
3. *Stocking Creek Park & Davis Lagoon*: Beautiful trails and a picnic area make Stocking Creek Park the perfect place for a nature walk. There are many trails meandering through the rainforest that lead to the creek and to the falls.
Known as Davis Lagoon, or just "the Lagoon" by locals, this is a special place where Stocking Creek meets the ocean and the tide fills it up and empties twice each day. This



area is a popular location for kayakers and locals to observe the weekly log barge in action.

4. *Saltair Centennial Park*: This large, multi-sport community park in Saltair offers a ball field, picnic shelter, playground, pickleball courts, sports court and tennis courts, plus forested trails for cool walks in the summer months.
